



CITY OF TAYLOR HOUSING PROGRAMS

Amy Young Barrier Removal Program

The City of Taylor, in partnership with Equity CDC (a 501c(3) nonprofit organization), participates in the Amy Young Barrier Removal Program through the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. This program provides grants of up to \$18,200 for accessibility modifications and home repairs. Applicants must include a Person with Disability, must have a household income that does not exceed 80% of the Area Median Family Income (see table below), and may be tenants or homeowners.

HOME Program



The City is eligible to apply for HOME funds through the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. The City currently participates in the Homeowner Rehabilitation Assistance (HRA) portion of the HOME program which provides funding for the rehabilitation or reconstruction of single-family homes. The City is currently funding four houses per fiscal year. Applicants must: own and occupy the home to be assisted which must be within the city limits of Taylor; have a household income that does not exceed 80% of the Area Median Family Income (see table below); must not have any significant liens, restrictions or encumbrances against the property; and must be current on all property taxes.
